


Guiding Prinicples of Urban and Transport Planning in the 1960s – 1970s

- Spatial Separation of Urban Functions
- Separation of transport modes according to their speed
- Urban Planning: The "structured and aerated city"
- Strengthening the Role of the Car clearing the line, i.e. the city, for the car




Metropolitan Highway in Berlin-Steglitz

Re-Unifaction of Transport Systems




30 years of separation consequently led to different transport networks in East and West Berlin

Migration and Urban Sprawl




Migration out of town leads to more urban sprawl






Change of Modal Split




Public Space / Person Public Transport

Public Space / Person Motorised Individual Transport




Polycentric Urban Structure







State Development Plan for the Nearby Densely Populated Area with Potential Spaces for Settlement






Reconstruction of the Inner City





Revitalisation of Derelict Spaces





The *Spreespeicher* in East Berlin is but one example for the successful reconstruction of the historic building stock in conjunction with the revitalisation of the surrounding areas.


